Being a construction company, Taylor acknowledges the varied and high-risk tasks that occur on a daily basis in the operations of the company and endeavour to protect the health and well-being of all persons on site. In achieving this and improving our OHS performance we aim to:

- Reduce LTI's annually for an overall goal of zero.
- Comply with all legislative requirements.
- Continually monitor and mentor subcontractors on site through SWMS compliance checks and Safety Meters.
- Reduce MTI's and FAI's through reviewing incidents and implementing controls.

Strategy integrated to achieve this:

- Continual recording of all workplace incidents to determine reoccurring incidents, review of controls to ensure they prevent incidents from occurring.
- Communication with law making and advisory bodies to receive updated legislative requirements for construction sites.
- Communicating changes to our employees and subcontractors through toolbox talks, safety alerts, training sessions and our safety committee.
- Weekly hazard inspections to determine subcontractors' safety.
- SWMS reviews to ensure subcontractor compliance with their SWMS.

We have and further will implement:

- Co-ordination of safety meetings.
- Provide necessary resources to eliminate hazards on site.
- Provide safety training as required.
- Provide all employees, contractors and visitors with an appropriate safety induction dependent on the work they carry out.
- Participate and co-operate with any safety initiatives being undertaken on sites.

This policy will be reviewed in December 2023.
